



## COVID19 – Visiting – types of visit

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### Screened visits – in the pods

- These visits will be for specific timescales determined by each home
- These are scheduled and booked through Jezzam by registered visitors
- There can be up to four visitors from the same household/bubble
- The visitors should arrive in one car to manage the 'traffic' on site
- There should be a clear designated parking spot for these visits
- There must be a risk assessed route from the car to the pod and back and visitors should be chaperoned (by either a colleague or a trained volunteer) to and from
- All of the infection prevention control questions need to be asked on arrival and appropriate actions taken e.g. temperature and handwashing
- **No personal protective equipment (PPE) needs to be worn** in the pod
- There is **no need for a Lateral Flow Device (LFD) test** to be completed
- A signed code of conduct must be on record for these visits

### Face to face visits with testing

- There can be two 'named persons' for each resident who can utilise these visits. They must be named in the resident's care plan

*(These were originally in one side of the pod and for half an hour – they can now be in other designated areas in the home that are agreed with David Morgan and risk assessed. The increased number of areas where these visits can take place will mean that we can expand the time and the frequency as required and appropriate)*

- These are scheduled and booked through Jezzam by registered visitors
  - The two named visitors can come at separate times or together IF they are from the same household/bubble
  - If the visitors come together they should arrive in one car to manage the 'traffic' on site
  - There should be a clear parking spot specifically for each designated area when delivering this type of visit
  - There must be a risk assessed route from the car to the designated area and back and visitors should be chaperoned (by either a colleague or a trained volunteer) to and from
  - All of the infection prevention control questions need to be asked on arrival and appropriate actions taken e.g. temperature and handwashing
  - **A LFD test needs to be taken** in a designated area and the named visitor waits for the test to present in an appropriate area (e.g. car)
  - The LFD test must be registered online
  - Appropriate **PPE will be supplied and must be worn** throughout the visit and correctly donned and doffed
  - With correct PPE the named visitor can hold hands with the resident but should not hug and keep contact to a minimum – in-line with the code of conduct
  - A signed code of conduct must be on record for these visits
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## COVID19 – Visiting – types of visit

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### Garden Visits

- These visits will be for specific timescales determined by each home
- Garden visits take place in a designated area in the garden
- These are scheduled and booked through Jezzam by registered visitors
- There can be up to four visitors from the same household/bubble
- The visitors should arrive in one car to manage the 'traffic' on site
- There should be a clear parking spot specifically for this type of visit
- There must be a risk assessed route from the car to the designated area in the garden and back and visitors should be chaperoned (by either a colleague or a trained volunteer) to and from
- All of the infection prevention control questions need to be asked on arrival and appropriate actions taken e.g. temperature and handwashing
- Only **a mask needs to be worn** for garden visits
- Visitors must remain socially distanced throughout the visit and are therefore not allowed to touch
- There is **no need for a LFD test** to be completed
- A signed code of conduct specifically for garden visits must be on record

### Readings and Breaking of Bread

- There must be a designated area for these activities
  - There should be a clear parking spot specifically for the visitor conducting this activity
  - There must be a risk assessed route from the car to the designated area in the garden and back and visitors should be chaperoned (by either a colleague or a trained volunteer) to and from
  - The two or three individuals leading the readings should be the same people each week for the first four weeks from 03/05 (in this sense they are 'named persons'). Only one individual should be present at once
  - There should be a maximum rota of four people who conduct the Breaking of Bread service for the first four weeks from 02/05 (in this sense they are 'named persons'). Only one individual should be present at once
  - All of the infection prevention control questions need to be asked on arrival and appropriate actions taken e.g. temperature and handwashing
  - **A mask should be worn** to conduct this activity **or alternatively a visor** if 'lip reading' is helpful
  - Visitors must remain socially distanced throughout the visit and are therefore not allowed to touch
  - **A LFD test needs to be taken** in a designated area and the 'named visitor' waits for the test to present in an appropriate area (e.g. car)
  - The LFD test must be registered online
  - A signed code of conduct must be on record for these visits
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
